Dear Students:

As detailed in Syracuse University's public health plan and in the Syracuse University reopening plan submitted to New York state, beginning this week we begin the second round of COVID-19 surveillance testing of all students. All students—including those who live off campus—are required to participate in this surveillance testing program.

Here's what you need to know:

- There are two testing locations:
 - 1) Kenneth A. Shaw Quad (North Campus; two stations)
 - 2) SkyBarn (South Campus).
- The testing centers will be open from 10 a.m.-6 p.m.
- No appointment is necessary to be tested.
- Students may report to the testing station they prefer and at their convenience.
- Please do not eat, drink or brush your teeth for 30 minutes prior to testing.

The testing schedule is as follows:

- Sept. 8: Residents of Ernie Davis and Sadler Halls; Architecture; Arts and Sciences
- Sept. 9: Residents of Ernie Davis and Sadler Halls (alternative); Architecture (alternative); Arts and Sciences (alternative)
- Sept. 10: Education; Engineering and Computer Science; Maxwell
- Sept. 11: Falk; iSchool; Newhouse; Visual and Performing Arts
- **Sept. 14: Law; Whitman; University College**
- Sept. 15 : Falk (alternative); iSchool (alternative); Newhouse (alternative); Visual and Performing Arts (alternative)
- Sept. 16: Education (alternative); Engineering and Computer Science (alternative); Maxwell (alternative)
- Sept. 17: Law (alternative); Whitman (alternative); University College (alternative)
- Sept. 18: Architecture (alternative); Arts and Sciences (alternative)

Ongoing COVID-19 surveillance testing is a critical dimension of the University's strategy to mitigate the potential for an outbreak on our campus. For that reason, students should plan to be tested in accordance with the schedule above. If for whatever reason you cannot be tested on your first assigned date, an alternative testing date has also been assigned to each school/college.

If a student's screening is positive for COVID-19, they will be contacted directly by the Barnes Center to arrange for diagnostic testing. Isolation and contact tracing will begin immediately. If your screening is negative, you will receive notification by email.

Thank you for your cooperation as we work collectively to safeguard the health and well-being of the campus and Syracuse communities.
