Listening to the Elders Speaker Series: Jamie Jacobs, Seneca (Turtle Clan)

Jamie Jacobs will speak on the importance of oral tradition, his experience working with elders over the years, and his role as managing curator of the Rock Foundation collections at the Rochester Museum and Science Center.

As a ceremonial custodian in the longhouse of the Tonawanda Seneca, Jamie officiates traditional funerals, weddings, and ceremonies. He practices the traditional art of working with porcupine quills, including research of ancestral-made pieces to study construction techniques and design. He is one of the last Seneca language speakers in his community and helped to establish the Tonawanda Adult Cohort Language program to ensure preservation of the language.
